“To Know Christ and To Make Him Known”



Dear Siblings in Christ,

We are about to enter Lent. We start with one of the most emotional services of the church year on Ash Wednesday

(February 18). On Ash Wednesday we are faced with our mortality along with our morality.

Ashes were used when a person or nation faced utter destruction because of their evil ways as a sign that they were ready to turn away from their sinfulness. Job sits among the ashes when his whole world is destroyed. Abraham acknowledges that he is nothing but dust and ashes when he bargains with God for the lives of the people living in Sodom and Gomorrah. The King of Ninevah sits in ashes when he hears the warning of Jonah to his people. Ashes were always used at a time when there was a life-or-death situation. This is true for Ash Wednesday as well.

Every year we gather to remember that like Abraham we are simply dust and ash. Even as we acknowledge our mortality, we know that it is our sinfulness which causes death. From the beginning, humans were created to live in harmony with our Creator and each other, but we all sin and fall short of that calling. Ash Wednesday forces us to acknowledge our sinful nature. It makes us face our immoral choices head on. It challenges us to acknowledge that we are but dust and will return to dust again.

But like the stories of ashes being used in the Old Testament, we come acknowledging our sins and turning away from death to life. So, on Ash Wednesday, we do not simply sit in ash to mourn our losses, but we receive ash in the shape of the cross to remind us where to turn for life.

May the ashes at the beginning of Lent point you to the end of Lent and the way to everlasting life!

CROSS-FOCUSED CHRISTIANS


Some passages in the Bible seem to be completely out of place. For example, why did Jesus explain in Matthew 6 that "*the eye is the lamp of the body*" (verse 22, NIV) right in the middle of some materialism-blasting verses like, "*Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth*" and "*You cannot serve both God and money*" (verses 19, 24, NIV)?

What do our earthly treasures and Christ's "*You cannot serve both God and money*" statements have to do with our eyes?

We know that looking at fancy advertisements with our eyes can directly impact how we use the material blessings God entrusts to us. But could it also be that Jesus is warning us against the foolishness of walking along His path with our right eye on heavenly treasures and our left eye on earthly treasures? When we do that, we become a "diverted-eye Christian"! We are then unable to focus clearly on the eternal things that matter.

Thank God that Jesus is not only our **Way**, but He's also the **Light** for our path, and He even offers eye salve to help us see clearly as we follow Him.

Let's be clear-sighted, focused Christians by keeping both of our eyes on the cross of Jesus.





SUMMER CAMP


