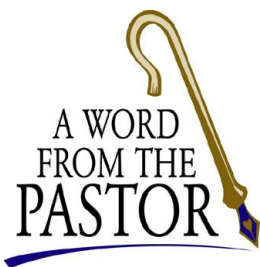

Dear Siblings in Christ,

We are entering the time after Pentecost, often called ordinary time, in the church year. This means that during the summer and into fall, we do not have many festival Sundays and there is no longer seasons. Sometimes it seems that these are boring Sundays—they are ordinary after all. So there is a tendency for church attendance to be lower and there are less programs, especially in the summer. But this year I would like you to reflect on what ordinary times in our personal lives look like and why they are important. As you do this, hopefully you realize that ordinary time in the church is the same way.

Ordinary days and months offer structure to our lives. They are days we go to work or school. For students, they are the days that we do much of our learning. For workers, they are the days that are usually the most productive. For retired people, these are the days that structure your time and help you with a routine. For all of us, they are dull, uneventful times. Everyone gets more excited about Christmas than June 10 (unless that is your birthday). Yet we all know that it is on ordinary days that we enjoy time with family or friends, we have restful sleep, we try new activities, we eat healthy food. These are the times of growth and often the moments when we come to new understandings and are very creative.

The same can be true for the church in ordinary times. The whole church can have some rest, get a little bored, and also be more attentive to God's presence. Individuals can grow in their faith and often have new insights and hope during the ordinary time of the church year. So don't neglect to come together to worship during these ordinary times—they are important!

I pray that the Holy Spirit will help your ordinary time be a time of growth and new insights this year.

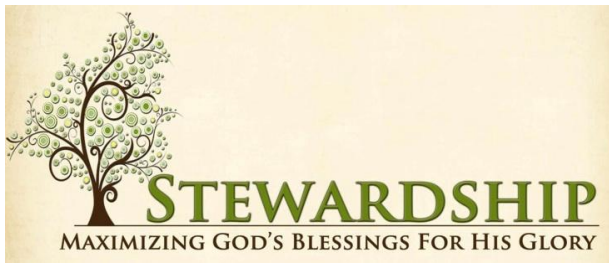

A MESSAGE FROM STEWARDSHIP

STEWARDSHIP IN THE MIDST OF SPRING'S BUSY JOY

Spring arrives with a certain energy: full calendars, celebrations, and sacraments. The Easter season fills our churches with joy, while graduations, First Communions, weddings, and the close of the school year fill our calendars with events. It is a beautiful time, but also a busy one. In the midst of it all, how do we continue to live out God's call to Christian stewardship?

The answer is not to escape the busyness, but to invite God into it.

Easter reminds us that we are a Resurrection people. Christ has conquered death, and because of that, everything we do—no matter how ordinary—can be filled with new life and purpose. Stewardship is not something we add to our schedule; it is how we live within it.

"He indeed died for all, so that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised." (2 Cor. 5:15)

The first gift of stewardship—time—can feel especially stretched during this season. Yet even on the busiest days, we are called to remain rooted in prayer. This may not look like long periods of silence, but rather small, intentional moments like morning prayer before a busy day, a time of reflection at the end of that busy day, or a quiet conversation with God in the car between events. These moments anchor us in what matters most.

The second gift—talent—is on full display in spring. We see it in students achieving milestones, in the beauty of weddings, and in volunteers coordinating parish events. These are not only accomplishments, but they are opportunities to glorify God. When we

use our gifts with humility and gratitude, we become witnesses to His goodness.

Who are we serving in this season? We can offer a kind word to a stressed parent or teacher, a helping hand at a parish function, sign up to help with vacation Bible school, or simply show up fully present to those around us. These are all powerful acts of stewardship.

Finally, **treasure**, flows naturally when we recognize every single thing we have is a gift from God. In a season filled with celebrations and commitments, it can be tempting to let charitable giving become secondary. Yet Christian stewardship calls us to intentional, sacrificial giving to support the mission of the Church.

Our parishes, schools and ministries depend on the faithful generosity of God's people to proclaim the Gospel and serve those in need. Giving is a prayerful act of trust offered first and with purpose. When we give sacrificially even in the busy seasons of life, we proclaim that God, not our schedules, comes first.

“Honor the Lord with your wealth, with first fruits of all your produce.” (Proverbs 3:9)

The beauty of stewardship is that it is not separate from our life filled with activities, but it is woven into it. The celebrations, the milestones, even the busyness are all invitations to live more fully as disciples. This spring, as we move from one moment to the next, remember: God is already there.

Meet God with our time. Offer God our talents. Trust God with our treasure.

Lutheran World Relief School Kits contain essential supplies to help children—and in some cases—adults continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. Please place items in the containers marked “School Kits.” Thank you so much for helping individuals who are in need.

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8” X 10½”; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secured together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secured together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2½” eraser

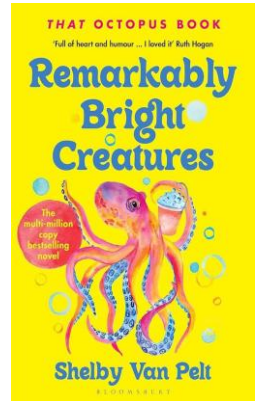
every Sunday immediately after service. We will share coffee, tea, and treats. If you would like to bring something to share, please do. Hope to see you there.
