A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Merry Christmas!!

I pray that you have known God's presence and love from the First Day of Christmas and continue to experience Christ with you!

During Advent, I was writing reflections on hymns of Advent for St. Stephen's midweek service. This forced me to look closely at the words in those hymns and also inspired me to read the lyrics to many of my favorite Christmas carols. I found myself returning to one carol that I really did not like when I was younger: *Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming*.

It was a hymn that I only remember singing at a hymn sing when I was younger—maybe it was a Christmas caroling time at church? But one of the members of the church and her family apparently loved this hymn so it was requested. But it is not a peppy, fun or festive carol that we hear carolers sing out or find on our radios. It just seemed stupid to me. Yet, as an adult, I really appreciate this carol.

I appreciate that it is more somber and reflective. But also appreciate the image of Jesus being a rose blooming eternally. Though I never realized it until reading more about this hymn, the rose was used as a symbol for centuries for Jesus and sometimes for Mary. The lyrics tie the messages of hope from Isaiah, especially the image of new life from the stump of Jesse and the promise of the everlasting covenant, directly to Jesus. But in the LBW (the green hymnal) there is also a beautiful verse about the shepherd's experience on the first Christmas which

helps me ponder how the shepherds felt during and after their angelic visit. The final verse is a soulful prayer to Jesus as son of Mary to bring us to the courts of heaven and into endless joy.

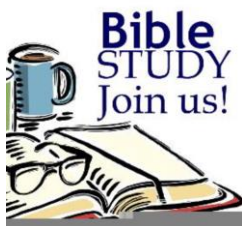

If any other designation is made on your envelope, it will be deposited into “Offerings For My Church.”

Also, to make things easier for our Money Counting group, if you are making contributions for several weeks at a time, please complete information on just ONE offering envelope. They do not record information based on Sundays; they use the date it will be deposited into the bank. They meet every other Monday to do their work. The first deposit date in 2026 will be January 12.

A MESSAGE FROM STEWARDSHIP

RESOLVE TO EMBRACE GOD'S COMPASSION IN THE NEW YEAR.

January is traditionally the time for new beginnings, fresh starts. For the Christian steward, the grace of being given another day, or God willing, a whole new year, stirs our deep gratitude. But it also calls us to ask what a “resolution” should really be. Our first resolve should always be to involve ourselves more intimately in the life of Christ, and how better to do that than by embracing Christ’s call to be compassionate?

After all, Jesus himself instructed us, “Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate” (Luke 6:36). Clearly, we strive now to live and give compassionately, as we generally understand the term. We try to be kind, considerate and understanding individuals. We share with others. But Jesus’ words challenge us to embrace a compassion that is much deeper, much more radical than our general understanding. The word compassion, at its root, means “to suffer with.” This goes beyond merely writing a check, offering a prayer or sending a note. Suffering is not a popular notion in our society, and we strive to avoid it. But now we hear Christ instructing us to “suffer with” the poor, the vulnerable, the powerless, the neglected and the weak.

How can we possibly choose such a journey, this challenge to be truly present to those who suffer? All things are possible with God, and it is through a commitment to a life of discipline, discipline in action and discipline in prayer, that we move towards the goal of true compassion.

The Christian steward is committed to the Eucharistic life [a life of giving thanks], and it is through this life which Christ offers us that we gain the courage and the will and even the need to follow him in his own example of compassion. Compassion is the doorway to a more responsive stewardship and a committed discipleship. Through our deepening sense of compassion, may we resolve to be the kind of Christian stewards who bring Christ’s presence more profoundly to a suffering world.

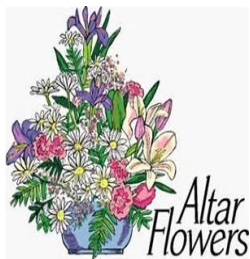
